FROM OUR HOUSE TO YOUR HOUSE

The Hospitality House received many works of mercy from churches and groups throughout the Belleville Diocese as they strove to reflect God's love and mercy. Many were motivated by the 2016 Jubilee (December 8, 2015—November 20, 2016) as announced by Pope Francis. It was the 27th holy year in history. The focus of this Jubilee of Mercy was to direct our attention and actions "on mercy so that we may become a more effective sign of the Father's actions in our lives....a time when the witness of believers might grow stronger and more effective." A look at our 2016 Financial Report (page 3) will reflect the generosity of the local churches toward Hospitality House ministry.

In addition, seven deacons from the Diocese of Belleville gave a day of service to the HHouse in June. The front porch was scraped and painted, flower gardens weeded, sidewalk patched, and two rooms plus outdoor furniture painted. Thank you Deacons Wayne, Don, Steve, Ron, John, Bob, and Corby.

In July of 2015, twelve energy efficient windows were installed on the second story at the Hospitality House. What a blessing and savings those windows are. They have reduced our energy consumption, reduced outside noise, and lowered our bills. The eleven first story windows need to be replaced. HOSPITALITY HOUSE DIRECTOR



Aminah Coleman has been the Hospitality House Director for fourteen months since November 8, 2015. We on the Hospitality House Board find Aminah a great asset and director for the house. She has served 371 guests this past year and has kept the Hospitality House open 232 days or sixty-four per cent of the year. In addition to taking care of the Hospitality House, Aminah works a full time job. Aminah has been touched by the dedication of many guests who have to travel so far to visit. A large percentage of Hospitality House guests come from the Chicago area; however, some guests have traveled from

Colorado, Texas, Ohio, Alaska, Ireland, and Germany. These trips are costly and require some guests to save money for a year or more before they have enough money. This reaffirmed to Aminah how important the Hospitality House is in helping families stay in contact.

The Hospitality House ministers to families and friends visiting incarcerated loved ones at prisons and mental health facilities around Chester, Illinois. Hospitality House opened it doors to ease the hardship of paying for overnight lodging. The hardship of having a loved one incarcerated in prison or committed due to mental health issues can leave a family financially devastated. Our mission is to provide low-cost lodging in a home-like atmosphere 365 days a year to ease some of the burden. The suggested donation for an overnight stay is currently a very reasonable \$20 a night.

The Hospitality House is sustained by donations from guests, churches, organizations, families, and friends. The average cost to operate the house per day in 2016 was \$40.02 per day. This amount is easy to reach if there are daily guests staying at the Hospitality House. However, during times of "lockdown" (where visits are suspended or reduced to one hour a day) or inclement weather, Hospitality House often has days with no guests and depend upon your generous donations.

Will you be a part of the Hospitality House ministry? If you have donated in the past, you know how appreciated your donation is as well as how transparent we are with our finances. You have kept us going for thirty-one years and will be the difference to keep us going for the next thirty-one years! The 2016 financial report is included in this newsletter. This is our way to let you know how funds at the Hospitality House are managed. Along with this newsletter is an addressed envelope. Each year we send out a financial appeal to you, and it is through your generosity the Hospitality House has been a success. When you help the Hospitality House, YOU are touching the lives and supporting prison family ties. In closing, "Do not neglect to show hospitality, for by that means some have entertained angels without knowing it. Be mindful of prisoners as if you were sharing their imprisonment, and of the ill-treated as of yourselves, for you may yet suffer as they do." Hebrews 13:2-3.

WINDOWS.....Replacing the current first-story windows at the Hospitality House saves on heating and cooling bills. These new windows will be easy to open and close in spring and fall when outside air is desired. Another advantage of these replacement windows is both sashes tilt out for convenient cleaning. The mission of the Hospitality House is to provide low-cost overnight lodging to prison families; a reduction in expenses will ease the budget. The Hospitality House is seeking your assistance in replacing our eleven first-floor windows. Will you be a part of this window project at the Hospitality House in 2017? The eleven main floor windows are extra large: 30" to 48" X 85 1/2" and have to be special ordered and made. Each window costs \$471. Window sponsors are recognized by having their name displayed on a placard in the foyer.
